But Francis, dost thou be so valiant- Oh, Lord, sir, I'd be sworn on all the books in England. I could find it in my heart. Francis- Hold art thou, Francis. Let me see. A comicalness next I shall be- Francis! Ana, anna! Greetings and welcome to Francis Bacon and the Gnostic English Empire. The hidden life is best. That's what Francis Bacon thought. And that's what Francis Bacon got for over 400 years. But we on to Francis. We on to those Brits. We're on to that whole invisible college, invisible empire thing. It's the episode two. What is Gnosticism? Why does it lead to Scientism? Why is that such a potential catastrophe? Stick around. I'm going to tell you all about it. Who was Francis Bacon? Well, actually, Captain, I'm of the British Secret Service. The name is Bond, James Bond. My name is Robert Frederick, and I'm very happy to be here with you today. In episode one, we described Francis Bacon and his fellow English aristocratic elite as Gnostics. Please listen to that episode for an introductory biography of Bacon and a description of his life and times and why I call him the smartest and most influential man who ever lived.

That's a huge claim, but I can back it up. Bacon and a few ingenious characters from Tudor London in the mid-1500s at the very start of the English Empire, perfected the technique of staying hidden. They perfected the ability of hiding in plain sight, as it were. There are solid historical reasons for this that we will get into very soon. This obsession with secrecy and its handmade Mendacity is nowhere more clearly shown than in the social phenomenon that has always existed, the secret society. I strongly recommend Bryan Hayden's new book, The Nature of Ritual in Pre-History: Secret Societies and the origin of political complexity. Link in the show notes. It's a key to understanding social history up to our present day. Via archeology and anthropology — Hayden shows the astonishing influence of secret societies in ancient times and in hunter-gatherer groups of our present time. Yes, secret societies we have always had with us. Secret societies want you to know that they exist. They just don't want you to know their secrets. It's a key aspect of their modus operandi. Historically, secret societies were all quite similar, and the main purpose of their existence was to enrich their members and to control the political process of a community.

One key way they did this was by communicating with the gods and telling the people what the gods had to say. They became so powerful that in many ancient communities, in order to become chief, one had to be a member of the local secret society. They would frequently resort to terror in order to maintain control. In insulting the gods or mocking the secret society was dangerous to your health. Secret societies would form alliances, and their influence in ancient times might spread over hundreds of square miles. Almost all secret societies were religious or had religious elements. Theater and ritual and dance and initiation were always important. The priesthoods of ancient Egypt were a secret society. The mystery schools of the ancient Middle East, like Mithraism or Eleusian mystery school were secret societies. Modern secret societies take more varied forms like the mafia or the inner sanctum of a cult like Scientology. They no longer control communication with the gods that spun off centuries ago into the major world religions, and has now even larger to have been given over to us as individuals. That's one of the arcs of Western history. But they may control that communication with their own members you know, the average cult leader.

He'll tell you what God has to say. Francis Bacon played a major role in two secret societies, one of which went on to become the most successful secret society of all time: British Freemasonry. Hundreds and hundreds of the

English elite have been Freemasons over the last few centuries. Freemasonry is absolutely a key component of the English Empire, and Freemasonry is Gnostic. To become a Freemason, one must take a vow of secrecy, and the person making that vow agrees that should he violate the vow of secrecy, he will be killed in a horrible manner by his brethren, as Freemasons call each other. Yo, this is my brother, Freemason. Actually, a Mason would never do that. My mistake. Thousands and thousands of books have been written about Masonry. But surprisingly, very few people know anything about it. If they have heard of it, they think it's a men's club, a beer and fork club, a hangout. Nothing could be further from the truth. It is a very serious, intensely esoteric, and a cult-based secret society with roots in the ancient religions of the ancient past. To be accepted into Freemasonry, you have to be initiated. The initiation involves you being blindfolded or hoodwinked, as it's called, partially naked, stripped of all your possessions with a knife at your throat, swearing allegiance to the brotherhood and swearing to keep secret.

All that passes in the lodge, as they call the rooms where Mason's meet. Freemasonry announced itself to the world on St. John's Day, June 24th, 1717. A very intricate, very complex, fully-formed, secret society decided to go public. The reverse of the fact that so few people know anything about Freemasonry despite its ubiquity, is the fact that Freemasonry has become a cliché of conspiracy research because they do pop up almost everywhere in recent world history. Freemasonry is Gnostic, a fact that is openly discussed by major Freemasons who are also leading scholars of the craft, as it's called, the craft of Freemasonry. It's no secret. Ha ha ha. It's just not talked about. It's a fact. Freemasonry is closely aligned with Rosicrucianism, another secret society that has Francis Bacon's fingerprints all over it. Rosicrucianism is also Gnostic. As mentioned, thousands of British elite have been Freemasons, many kings, some say every king. And many princesses. No princesses, no women allowed. Freemasonry, no doubt, came to the United States on the first ship that landed in Jamestown. My bet is with the Plymouth colony as well. Nothing says espionage better than the words English Empire, and nothing suits espionage better than the absolute secrecy that surrounds a Masonic lodge.

Plymouth colony was still part of the empire, so you can be sure there were spies from the crown involved. Before we dive any more into the world of Masonry with its ancient roots, let's discuss the even more ancient roots of Gnosticism, which is the source from which sprang Freemasonry. Gnosticism is a religion or a group of religious sex that date back to the earliest days of Christianity, to the days of the apostles. Some take it back even further, a couple hundred years earlier. There were many different Gnostic sex, and many contained overt Christian elements, and many considered Jesus Christ to be a significant influence on their philosophy. Many Gnostic sects also contained overt Jewish elements such as the Kabbala, which is a Gnostic form of Judaism, and much of which dates to this time period. Kabbala plays a huge role in the higher degrees of Freemasonry. Just as Christianity contains within it much of Judaism, and Judaism contains elements of the ancient Egyptian religion, Gnosticism contains many, many different elements of older religions, elements from Zoroastrianism, the source of Kabbala, and from Pythagoras, from Plato, and Neoplatonism, from the ancient Egyptian religion. There are elements of Buddhism and Hinduism.

Gnosticism is a cornucopia of religions, just as is Freemasonry. Gnosticism coalesced into strange new configurations that became widespread in the Middle East in the first few centuries after the death of Jesus. The first Gnostic is considered to be Simon Magus, or Simon the magician, who appears in the New Testament in the Acts of the apostles, offering to pay the apostle Peter to teach him magic, the magic that Christ use and that the apostles are now using. Yes, Gnosticism is about magic. The purpose of the magic is to allow the soul of the Gnostic to gain sparks of light or Gnosis, and thereby to escape confinement from the evil realm of materiality and to be reborn into the realm of the true God, the God of light, above and away from this earthly realm. As we will be

seeing, Bacon constantly makes odd references to light in his writing, one in particular at the climax of his most famous book, The New Atlantis. But I get ahead of myself. Perhaps you see the influence of Buddhism and Hinduism on Gnosticism. Perhaps you notice a similarity to Christians who believe they are not of this world, but just passing through to their true home over Jordan, to their reward in the great beyond.

There are many similarities to many different religions that become apparent the more one studies Gnosticism. But what makes Gnosticism different from all of the religions from which it draws influence is that Gnostic believe that the God of this world, the Yahweh of the Bible, Jahwobble, the creator God, whatever you call the creator, maybe Allah or the great mystery, is not the true God. They believe in another God, a God behind God, a God of light. They believe that the God of this world is an evil God that has imprisoned human souls here on earth. Gnostics believe that only Gnostics, with Gnosis, the Greek word for knowledge, are aware of this fact and that knowing that fact sets them apart. Therefore, having the Gnosis makes the practicing Gnostic think of themselves as an elite among humanity, removed from the average Jebadiah or Josiah. Yes, Gnostics believe that the creator God of this world is evil, even though they acknowledge that the same creator God created the Earth and everything in it, meaning that the whole world is, in a sense, evil, even puppies and babies and flowers, although there may be a spark of light inside them, trapped by a deceptive evil, them, I urge, who uses things like puppies and flowers and babies to entice humans to become immersed in materiality.

Different sects have different beliefs on this. When a Gnostic says the word God, though, they mean the God behind God. Many Gnostic sex worship the snake from the Garden of Eden because that snake brought them the knowledge that freed them from the total control of the Creator. Or they worship Lucifer, the light bringer, the fallen angel who was kicked out of heaven for challenging the divine order. Lucifer, like Prometheus, gave man the gift of fire or light. Let us now open the book of Guido. Guido Giacomo Preparata. That is, in his book, The Ideology of Tyranny: the use of neo-gnostic myth in American politics. Mr. Preparata has done a truly remarkable job predicting by many years the now ubiquitous woke and social justice movement through which we are living with its critical race theory, its transgender rights emphasis, that insist that, quote, a man can be a woman, and that's legally, officially a woman. In its communist subtext and links to this phenomenon, and links this phenomenon to the Gnostic. Through the philosophy of French postmodernists like Foucault via George Bataille, who loved Gnosticism. Bataille was a more artsy and intellectual Alistair Crowley. Preparata studied the ancient religion of Gnosticism through the work of such scholars of myth and religion as Marcia Eliad in his book The sacred and profane, James Fraser's The Golden Bow, and Robert Graves, The White Goddess, among many other works.

Preparata writes on page 24 of The Ideology of Tyranny. "First of all, as Gnosis, this tradition was passed on as, quote, divine revelation, communicated only to a few elect, morally and intellectually prepared, in contra position to the common faith of the Christian masses. It was an elitist discourse. Second, there runs through the various sex of Gnostics, the claim that the human soul is a spark trapped in heavy matter, yearning for liberation. The body is a prison, said the Gnostic carpocrates. Therefore, emancipation can only be attained by way of separation, alienation, and withdrawal from the world, a withdrawal that may take the form of asceticism, or more interestingly, of a sovereign disregard for all human law, something describingable as a self-satisfied sentiment of perfection immune to the scrupels of ordinary, pious men. In other words, all sorts of, quote, infomies are permissible to the perfects so that they may free themselves from the enslaving cycles of reincarnation and join a superior realm of the Spirit, variously defined. Third, many Gnostics, such as the young Epiphanus, advocated in the name of Justice, that's with a capital J, Justice, a community of equality and unrestrained communism of possessions and sexual mates.

They invited to transgress all those man-made laws that have been imposed to delimit property. All such beliefs, thus built on a deep sense of comradeship that united the adepts by cementing that bond born out of misery and suffering in this world, a world depicted as a cold, often inhospitable realm. To continue on page 26, Fifth, most Gnostic teachers allowed, if not encouraged, the free and unrestrained indulgence of sex and intoxication. Sounds like Netflix. Which was the obvious corollary of a system of teachings that preconised a contemptuous indifferent toward the destiny of this misshapen earth. Though this set of creeds may not be unqualifiedly defined as infernal or satanic, certain of them, nonetheless, seem enough to engender in the seduced listener a refusal to recognize a superior authority. When that is the case, traditional religious orthodoxy denounced these conceptions as Luciferian."

You can imagine that in such a world, such a Gnostic world, there would be no conventional morality because anything goes no 10 Commandments for those with the Gnosis. All of life is essentially a pile of rocks. Have at it. Many Gnostic sects were known for strange rituals and extreme licentiousness, almost as if the more defilement, the more points you score with the real big guy, the God behind God, for desecrating a false creation and liberating your soul to join the God of light in the great, great beyond.

What happens with those with Gnostic beliefs occupy the highest position of power in the world's most successful empire? I wonder. Whereas there were once hundreds of Gnostic sex, only a few survived, and mostly have stayed completely underground until the occult revival of the mid-19th century. People like Eliphas Levi, people like Madame Blavatsky and Aliester Crowley, both of those were connected to —wait for it, British intelligence. What a shock. Overt Gnosticism is enjoying a resurgence of late, spurred by Elaine Pagel's book, The Gnostic Gospels, about the discovery of many Gnostic writings at Nag Hamadi in Egypt in the mid-1940s, buried in the sand. Her book was published in 1979 after years of scholarly study of the documents, and the book managed to make the religion of the evil God decidedly sexy and modern, comparing it to psychoanalysis, a comparison that perhaps has not aged well. It even won the National Book Award. The book is very interesting and was quite popular. Elaine Pagels became one of the few scholar stars in America. However, she spends very little time in the book on the Gnostic belief in the evil God and their belief that all materiality is essentially evil, and more on her understanding that Gnostic's belief that the truth is within and that it is for each person to discover it in order to gain their own noses or truth.

This is, in some ways, a decidedly modern notion for some Christians and Jews who may only believe in the written Gospel, but one to which few contemporary mainstream religious seekers after the truth would object. It's always been a tenant of Buddhism. But Buddhist do not share the Gnostic belief that the world is an evil prison. They think that it's just not the ultimate reality for which one should strive, which frankly, is a common belief shared by almost every culture that has ever existed, that there is more beyond, that we live in a shadow of greater worlds, something like Plato's Cave, total non-belief in other worlds, or even just atheism or materialism is almost non-existent historically in the world's first-known atheists, the Epicurians of Athens. I thought the world was quite a nice place, actually, and that one could, with some effort and intelligence, simply be happy and enjoy a good life in a quite beautiful world. Some religious scholars see Gnostic thought as an attempt to explain the existence of evil? Oddly enough, it doesn't seem to even do that because why wouldn't the God beyond God just go ahead and wipe out the evil of his demiurge?

That would do in all the dirty down here in the materiality of the earth plane? The problem of evil, as it is called in philosophy and theology, is still debated, and it has been for thousands of years. Historical Gnosticism was almost completely wiped out after Emperor Constantine made Christianity the official religion of the Roman Empire. If the books at Nag Hammadi had not been buried, they would have been burned. Secret sex of Gnostic did survive, however. There were three major sex and regions where Gnosticism made a big recovery in the dark ages and Middle Ages, probably due largely to the insane levels of corruption in the now all-powerful Catholic Church of Rome, leading many people to be attracted to Gnosticism. Gnostic priests were called perfecti, and some did lead impeccable lives by rejecting all worldly associations of during sex and meat and fine clothes. Some took the opposite course and practiced all forms of defilement since the world was evil, as we've spoken of. One was allowed to do anything as long as one was in a state of gnosis. Meanwhile, the use of magic promised not just an escape from prison, but many rewards in this earthly life.

Kind of attractive, no? Not to mention that the God of the Bible could be, shall we say, quite harsh. For many reasons, though, the numbers of Gnostics began to grow. This led to one of the most shameful episodes, one of many, in the history of the Catholic Church, the Albigencian and crusade, from which I believe we are still suffering blowback. As it eventually engulfed the mighty knights templars, of which there were many in that of Europe. The town of Albi, Albigensian Crusade, and the entire Languedoc region of France, where we're Gnosticism was widespread, where many Jews also lived who were conversant with Kabbala and from near where soon after, the whole idea of Christian Kabbala exploded into Renaissance Florence. It was decided that this Gnostic heresy, this heathen outbreak, should be stopped and a massacre of enormous proportions took place. That lasted for many decades in the early 13th century. Did you ever hear the phrase, Kill them all and let God sort them out? It came from the Pope during the Albigensian crusades. This crusade also happened to provide cover for a land grab by the French king. It all may be reinforced the belief that the world was indeed an evil place.

You think, maybe. Nice going Church of Rome. Here's where it gets weird, if it isn't weird enough already. It is understood that the nights templars had converted to Gnosticism while on their first crusade to the Middle East in the early 1100s, converted to a form of Gnosticism based on a belief in John the Baptist as the true redeemer with the metaphysics that included a spirit named Baphomet. No joke. It's in all the records. It's documented. The Templars had become an incredibly powerful and wealthy brotherhood sanctioned by the Catholic Church, answerable only to the Pope, a society of warrior Monks that had amassed an almost inconceivable wealth and influence despite their vow of poverty. But they were not more powerful than the Vatican. Fifty years after the end of the Albigensian crusade, they too were condemned as heretics. They confessed to worshiping, Baphomet, spitting on the cross, and other signs of heresy, encouraging homosexual amongst their members. Some were burned at the stake. The story has a twist. The nights templars mostly disappeared. Most of them escaped. Their lands were confiscated, but much of their gold was not, nor has ever been found. Their huge fleet of ships was moved to Portugal, which did not track down the templars.

It seems that Columbus sailed from Portugal under the flag of the templars about 1492, 190 years later. Many escaped to England and Scotland and laid low. Here is where the intense secrecy began. One wrong move and you could become just a log on the fire. Within a couple of centuries, the Knight's templars morphed into today's Freemasons using a strict code of secrecy. Their lives depended on it. This I consider to be the story of the last millennium. The power and influence of the templars eventually became the enormous power and influence of today's Freemasons. Hardly anyone noticed, hiding in plain sight, right in front of your eyes like a brilliant stage

magician, an incredible transformation occurred. The Templars were spread all over Europe, by the way. They went into hiding all over Europe. Freemasonry had links to the elite all over Europe when it did reveal itself, primarily in England, but also a lot in France, where the Templar headquarters was. This is not even a debatable topic anymore. The truth has been revealed. It was always there to see. It just wasn't talked about. It wasn't researched. The templars became the Freemasons. Read Born in Blood by the great historian John J.

Robinson for a fascinating telling of the details of that spectacular transformation. Exactly when the Masonic philosophy entered the House of Tudor is not known, but perhaps it was always there since Henry VII, with the French roots of the Plantagenet and the Scottish roots of the Stewart's, it was just waiting to emerge. The extreme occult symbolism used around Queen Elizabeth I, which suggests that it began in earnest during her reign. Francis Bacon, the English lawyer, philosopher, and the smartest, most influential man who ever lived, trademark, helped manage this transformation of the templars from a powerful Catholic religious order into a Protestant, powerful, occult, secret society, cult, ever to exist in the history of the world. Here is where it gets very interesting because it becomes very current up to the moment because the English Gnostic elite created contemporary modern science. Modern science was born with the founding of the Royal Society of London in 1660, 24 years after Bacon died. Bacon is acknowledged by the Royal Society as the inspiration for their founding. All the early members of the Royal Society were associated with Rosicrucianism and Freemasonry. Although Freemasonry had yet to be formally announced to the world, which would not happen until St. John's Day, 1717, June 24th, that is, right there near the Solstice. Freemasonry was already fully formed and in existence all over England and Scotland and parts of Germany and parts of France. The invisible college is a concept originating from Rosicrucianism and references the idea that an invisible group of learned men were pursuing knowledge for the advancement of all of humanity, supposedly for all of humanity. Science always sells its invention as a benefit for all of us to this very day. Like the nuclear bomb, right? That's good for all of us. Scientific inventions rarely are, although, as I told my dentist recently, there's no downside to the science of modern dentistry. Hurrah for lidocaine and teeny little high speed drills. Yes, of course, modern science can be good, but what if it has no moral fetters put upon it? Morality? What's that man? So I'm scientific, lad. So I'm Gnostic. A saying often associated with Francis Bacon is knowledge is power. I'm not sure why knowledge isn't compassion or love or good health or justice or virtue, something Socrates might have said. Remember, Bacon wanted to move past Plato and Socrates and Aristotle. So it's power.

Bacon was a cheerleader for science precisely in order to gain power, not just temporal power, but and get ready for this because this here is the crazy truth of it all, the truth of globalism, the Great Reset, the British Empire, the gnosis of the British Empire that is trying to course us with scientificism into giving up our rights. It's pure scientificism. What's the new saying? Trust the science. Trust the science. No longer trusting God. They certainly don't want us trusting in ourselves or thinking for ourselves or making up our own minds. Here it is. The Gnostic elite seek scientific power in order to challenge God, to literally and specifically gain power against the creator God, in effect, to steal the planet away from the creator. There, I said it. They are trying to steal the planet from the creator with science. How crazy do I sound? Hear me out. It's not crazy. Despite modern science and modern beliefs, religion is still the driving force that motivates the elite. Luciferians are trying to create a power strong enough that a human could guarantee another human eternal life. A power strong enough that a human could create life in a laboratory.

These are now the goals of modern science. Science is no longer about understanding or finding truth. It has now become nothing more than raw power and control. It's gone way beyond Frankenstein. Although Mary Schally was truly a visionary. Many people believe that science will give humanity eternal life. You see, it's gone past Frankenstein. That's right. It's called the singularity or the rapture of the nerds. It's big at Google or the head priest of this belief Ray Kurtzweil, holds court. Yes, because of the tremendous technological success of modern science, Scientism is now officially the world's newest and fastest growing religion. Listen to this quote straight from the philosopher, poet, genius himself, Francis Bacon, the man that got the ball rolling for modern science from his celebrated book, Nobem, Orgonum, or New Method. Further, it will not be made to distinguish the three kinds and, as it were, three grades of ambition in mankind. The first is of those who desire to extend their power in their native country, which kind is vulgar and degenerate. The second is of those who labor to extend the power of their country and its dominion among men. This certainly has more dignity, though not less covetousness.

But if a man endeavors to establish and extend the power and dominion of the human race itself over the universe, his ambition, if ambition, it can be called, is without a doubt a both more wholesome thing and a more noble than the other two. Let that sink in. Extend the power of their country and its dominion among men that certainly has more dignity. That sounds exactly like the English Empire. But here's the crazy part. But if a man endeavors to establish and extend the power and dominion of the human race itself over the universe, his ambition, if ambition, it can be called, is without a doubt of both more wholesome thing and a more noble than the other two. What? Is that not the definition of insanity? Is the smartest man who ever lived a stark, raving lunatic? It proves once and for all that brains are not all they are cracked up to be, that morality and judgment are much better features than a high IQ. Funny how our society has a test for IQ and does not have a test for decency and compassion. Just saying. Here is one of the glaring contradictions of the rise of Gnosticism and scientificism, which on the one hand considers human beings just bags of chemicals accidentally formed by random mutations and the four forces, yet simultaneously promotes the human race as having the potential and the capacity and the right to conquer the entire universe.

Got schizophrenia? We can say modern science was born 360 years ago. The consequences of its continued rise and influence in the world are impossible to fully encapsulate for good or for ill. I wouldn't be communicating with you right now without it. But one consequence is that atheism has grown tremendously. It's now hip to be an atheist, something which is almost unthinkable 300 years ago. David Hume was hesitant to publish his philosophy because it questioned the existence of God as recently as the 1700s. But I have yet to meet an atheist that isn't a follower and a big believer in scientificism, who doesn't believe in the Big Bang and the four forces, evolution by random mutation and natural selection. They've simply substituted one belief, God, for another science. They have a pure faith that science will eventually solve all of humanity's problems and answer all of humanity's questions. Is it the revenge of the templars? Because guess what? Science has no morality. It's a shitty and dangerous belief system. Science only deals with quantifiable information. Science then has no love. Love cannot be quantified. Science has no soul. There is no world of the Spirit for academic science.

Because of science, atheism must be true, right? Because the Bible was wrong about the origins of the world. It obviously did not start 5,000 years ago or whatever number of fundamentalists, Jews, and Christians, and Muslims put on it. Hindus think the world originated a lot longer than the 14 billion years and change modern

science says it did with full confidence. The Buddhist, they don't care. Who cares, man? Meditate. Everything is an illusion, man. But be a good person when you aren't meditating. You got it? Yes, I got it. Thank you for that. Science is a very dangerous religion, and it may have put humanity on the brink of an irreversible catastrophe. I guess catastrophes are irreversible, right? The brink of catastrophe, not the planet. The planet will be just fine no matter what humans do. It will recover in the cosmological blink of an eye. But humanity, toxic pesticides, genetically modified organisms, lab-creative viruses, hello, Wuhan, and Fauci, artificial intelligence guided killer drones, nuclear bombs, constant around-the-clock surveillance, social credit systems managed through cell phones, addictive psychotropic medications, nanotechnology injected into the bloodstream, out-of-control side effects of so many man-made laboratory medicines and vaccines, the dangerous list of the creations of modern science go on and on.

The list of the benefits is quite long as well. But the question is not how did we survive without science for so long, modern science for so long? The question is, how long will we survive with modern science? Imagine a world without electricity. We don't need it. It does, however, help those in power get even more powerful. The 20th century was the century of electricity. Two World Wars, atheistic revolutions that murdered millions and millions of lives. It was a first where they murdered their own people, not enemies of a different sort. These atheist revolutions, they murdered their own, millions and millions of their own just to gain power. Two outbreaks of unbridled fascism, one of those places they murdered their own before they set upon the other. Two nuclear bombs dropped on defenseless civilian populations, the worst single instantaneous cause of death of all time. Well, thanks, science. I'm not saying modern science is the cause of all this, but obviously, the Nazis could not have done what they did without modern technology provided by the scientific revolution. But nowhere was the cry heard, Regulate modern science. In fact, the science soaked companies, IBM, Bayer, Rockefeller, Standard Oil, they all only grew in power after the war, despite their enormous crimes during the war.

Thanks, science. It's quite telling that society has never managed to put together a panel that reviews new inventions for moral and technical ramifications before allowing their widespread use. As such, we are about to get driverless cars that nobody wants or needs. But big business smells profit. Robots are estimated to take millions of jobs away from human soon. There's a debate about all this. I don't see it anywhere. This is what science tells me, that I'm made up of a trillion or two trillion or even more cells. And each one of those cells contains hundreds of thousands of molecules. In each one of those cells is a total mystery how it began. Because it's so complex, hundreds of thousands of molecules dancing to unheard music, composed by an unknown composer, but tightly woven as much as any ballet, all to create your body, just your body alone. It's trillions of cells interwoven in an infinitely complex manner just to give one person a body and a mind to go into the world, also infinitely complex, to go into the world to find an identity, to find love, to find beauty, to make art, to raise children.

It's mind-blowing. It's mind-blowing. It makes everything more beautiful. Science makes everything more mind-blowing. Why is science attempting to create artificial wounds? Why is science attempting to create a human brain in the laboratory? Why are there human-animal hybrids? Why is science attempting to extend life as long as possible? Because science is also telling us there are too many human beings in the world. We are about to fry ourselves with global warming because we're dirty, bad humans who are destroying the planet. See the way it

works? Why do any of what I just mentioned? Could science be playing God? Did you ever get that feeling? Science wants to be God? Well, you were correct. Modern science exists exactly for that purpose because it was originated by Francis Bacon for exactly that purpose. But to really challenge God, they first have to conquer the planet. The empire has not quite got the whole planet. But that's what's actually happening, and it's working. The consequences of the First World War and the Second World War were to greatly expand English power and influence. But weirdly, the empire disappeared. The Brits took cover behind the mushroom cloud. You see, because the Yanks done it.

Be scared of the Yanks. We're just a little old island nation falling on hard times. We got bombed by Hitler. Now we're defenseless. You see how it works? Don't be fooled. It's still the Perfidious Brits. Just to make a quick segue to the present about how their espionage works, how it's always working. I can't help myself. I have to bring this up. But Prince Harry and Princess Megan are obvious and intelligence operation. Pure and simple. It's so brilliant that everyone has fallen for it. They either love them or hate them, but nobody sees that. He's here to keep an eye on the colony, these kids. Ari, lad, report back. Say they got the job. Get rid of that pesky First Amendment, Ari. I mean, seriously, this ginger prince telling Joe Regan to get the vax? And he's actually complaining about the First Amendment, which is probably the thing that is exceptional about America, besides our awesome music. I thought they came here for privacy. They can't stay away from the cameras. Oh, shut the bleep up, Ari. Now he's giving a spiritual advice and psychological advice. It's incredible. Oleg Gavalt, listen to this. The goals of the Invisible College of the Rosicrucians of the early 1600s are identical to the goals of today's science soaked transhumanists.

Without death, would human life have meaning? The issues raised by this podcast get into serious philosophical areas that have been debated for centuries, for millennia. I'm going to just raise the issues and continue exploring the impact that the life of Francis Bacon and the Gnostic English Empire has had and is having on the world. Bacon and Dee and Queen Elizabeth started that process, and it is working. They've almost done it, as a matter of fact, and the Great Reset is the next domino to fall. I guarantee you the Great Reset began in London. Prince Philip was on the board of the World Economic Forum. He's the guy that wanted to come back as a virus and destroy most of humanity. According to Bacon in the Nova Organum, he then wanted to conquer the whole universe.

Let's review. Because the universe was made by an evil God and they want humanity, the elites of humanity, to rest it away from this evil demiurge, they even see it as a sacred duty. The most well-known symbol of Freemasonry is the compass and square, enclosing the letter G. That G stands for many things, and one of those things is Gnosticism. We're destroying the planet. We have to be controlled. We have to be told what to do every minute of the day so we don't just ruin the planet. It's obviously preposterous. Trust the science? No, I'll trust in myself. I use critical thinking. Stay aware. My advice is study logic. Study the logical fallacies. I'll put a link in the show notes. It's really fun. It really does sharpen your thinking and helps you cut through the bullshit when someone's trying to convince you of something. Helps you cut right through the propaganda and the lies. I just want to end with saying I know it isn't very scientific, but do unto others as you would have them do unto you. Forgive, forget, be a good person. Take care of each other and the animals and the plants.
